She has presented at the state and national level on topics including cancer related cognitive impairments, comprehensive breast cancer rehabilitation, and addressing sexuality in oncology. Her current clinical and research interests include prehabilitation in surgical oncology, cancer related fatigue, and multidisciplinary geriatric oncology care. Hite is a recipient of the OTAC Janice Matsutsuyu Outstanding Service Award.
